Ideas for home: Reading:

Share stories. Encourage your child to talk about each page. Look at the pictures and predict what might happen next. Read with your at least four times a week. Play I-Spy games. Share a bedtime story.

Writing:

Encourage fine motor skills. Small world play, lego, tracing over their name, lines, patterns etc... **Maths:**

Count household objects to 5, then 10 together. Identify numbers together. Look for numbers on houses and car number plates. Count the stairs together.

Gross motor skills: Outdoor play. Playing with big apparatus, climbing frames etc... Bats and balls. Throwing and catching.
